ENTRIES: **ALL ENTRIES**, other than cooking, vegetables and those in the Wynyard Garden Club section need to be delivered to the showgrounds on **FRIDAY 7th March between 4.00 and 5.00pm**. Entries for cooking and vegetables need to be delivered on **THURSDAY 13th March between 4.30 and 5.00pm**.

JUDGING: Judging will take place for entries on **SATURDAY 8th March at 10:00am** and the cooking and vegetable sections will be judged from 5.00pm on **THURSDAY 13th March 2025**. **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE JUDGED.**

Recipe

Chocolate Simplicity Cake

3 tablespoons butter
2 level tablespoons cocoa
½ cup milk
1 cup sugar
pinch salt
1 cup S.R. flour
2 eggs



Melt butter place all other ingredients in a large mixing bowl. Pour the melted butter over the ingredients and beat hard for 3 minutes. Place mixture in a suitable cake tin and bake in a moderate oven for approximately 25 minutes.

When cool ice with chocolate icing.

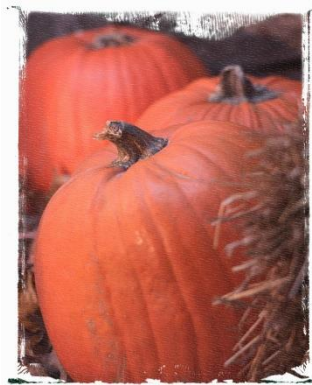
