<u>Method</u>: Beat eggs and sugar, add oil, then the dry ingredients. Lastly add carrots and walnuts. Bake in square tin in moderate over for 1 hour. When cold, ice with butter icing.

Recipe: 250mls clear honey, 125g castor sugar, 60g butter, ¼ pint water, 2 eggs (well beaten) 375g SR Flour, pinch salt, 1 tspn ground ginger, 1 tspn allspice.

Method: Heat honey, sugar, butter and water until butter melts. Cool slightly, sift dry ingredients, make a well in the centre, pour in eggs and liquid mix. Stir until blended.
